Principal's Report



We are approaching the end of Term 1 however there is still much to be done in the next week. This includes year 11 and 12 half yearly examinations; sport and Sydney Royal Agricultural Show.

On Friday our School Display team head to Sydney to prepare our display for the Sydney Royal Agricultural Show. Woodenbong Central School was the initial school that started this competition at the Royal Easter Show. Our displays at EKKA sparked the interest of those who run the Royal Easter Show in Sydney. The Schools' competition has grown significantly over the ensuing years.

The Schools Display at the Sydney Show provides a great opportunity to be creative, to work collaboratively with others students, to problem solve and to demonstrate their critical thinking skills. The students in the display team also have an opportunity to hone their communication skills as they discuss their display, our school and the surrounding area with members of the general public.

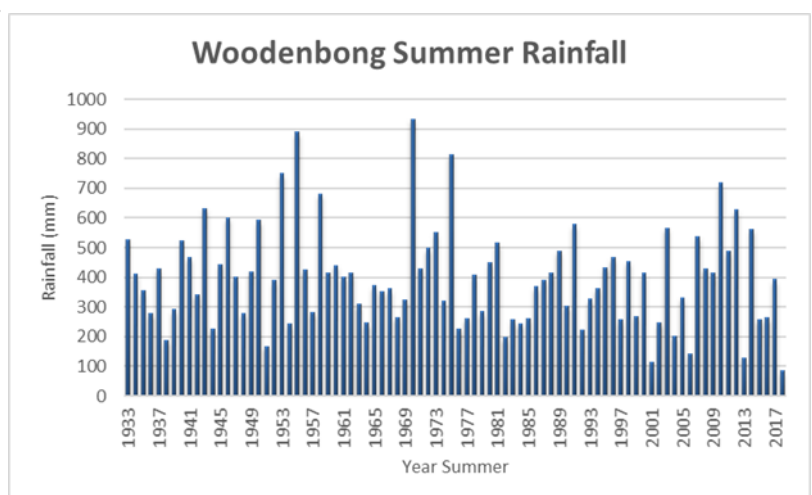


Opportunities allow our students to find out what they like and what might constitute future employment and career path. We also assist our students develop their talents through persistence, hard work and the development of a growth mindset. We believe that *our students deserve to live empowered lives with passion.*

There have been changes to Year 11 assessment tasks. In year 11 students will now have a maximum of 3 formal assessment tasks. Only one of these tasks can be a formal "HSC style" examination. For most subjects this will be their end of Preliminary HSC examination in Term 3. For most subject the half yearly examination does not count as a formal assessment item. However as it prepares students for their HSC examination next year most subjects are still running a half yearly examination. In their HSC year they can have a maximum of 4 assessment tasks.

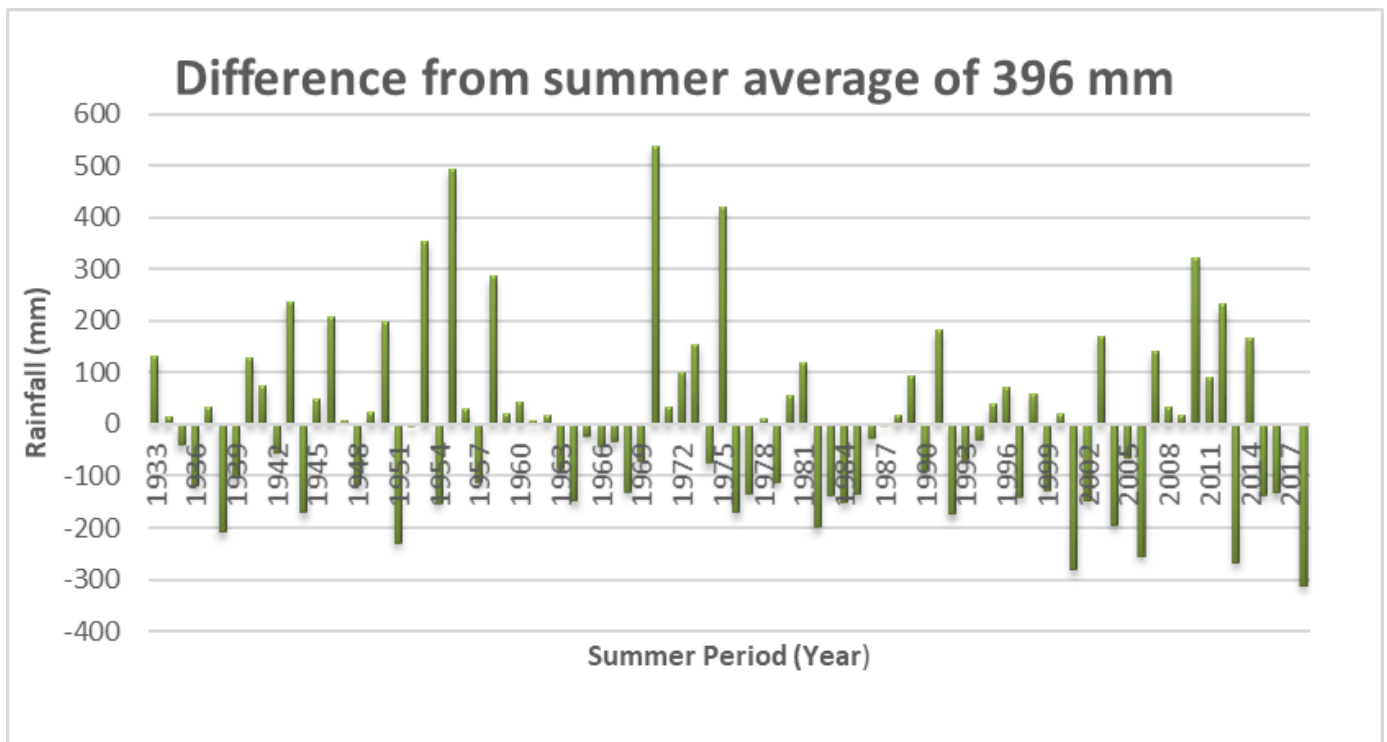
Rainfall over summer was below our expectations and I know it has caused concerns for many in our community. The recent rainfall has brought smiles to faces however, we know that more is required. Below are 2 graphs of summer rainfall (that is the total rainfall of December, January and February) since 1933:

We can see that the rainfall over the last summer (the column on the far right) is lower than previous years.



To highlight this the following graph show

the difference in summer rainfall from the long term summer average of 396 mm.

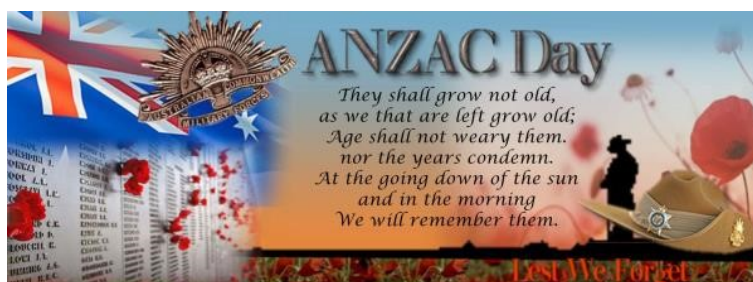

- Taking part in a Cost of Living appointment for help accessing more than 40 government rebates and savings.

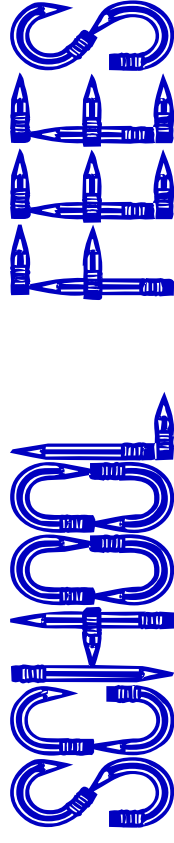
Mobile Service Centres will accept cashless payments by credit and debit card or cheque.
