# Principal's Report



Opportunities allow our students to find out what they like and what might constitute future employment and career path. We also assist our students develop their talents through persistence, hard work and the development of a growth mindset. We believe that *our students deserve to live empowered lives with passion.*

We have been notified by Essential Energy of a planned power outage in Woodenbong on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> June. We have organised for a generator to provide power to our server, computers in the front office and our till. We will be operational however will have reduced capacity to our normal operation. We will have no heating available that day.

It was sad to see that the building on our Agricultural Farm known to many as the Old Koreelah classroom is set to be demolished this week. The building had an attachment to many where that be as a classroom or a Tennis Clubhouse. However building reports from both the Department of Education and Kyogle Council showed that the building was unsafe. For the safety of staff, students and visitors the building was demolished. Mr Grimmett has identified items within the building and on the outside to be salvaged. Any of these materials that could be safely salvaged have been stored by Mr Grimmett and are available for the Progress Association to use.



Our Year 3, 5, 7, and 9 students sat for NAPLAN over the last 2 weeks. NAPLAN is an Australia wide literacy and numeracy examination. We can use this information along with the other information we gather to evaluate the effectiveness of our literacy and numeracy programs. This year our students sat the online version of NAPLAN. It should be noted that Year 3 students sat a paper writing test. On the whole NAPLAN at Woodenbong central School went well. However, there were issues with the online writing test. These issues were greater for our Year 9 students. Our Year 9 students completed the writing component of NAPLAN the following day, they were also offered the opportunity to re-sit the task on Tuesday of this week. The issue with the writing task affected many schools across the State and the Country. Hopefully, ACARA will sought out all the problems for next year.



Regular attendance at school assists with student learning. When a student is absent from school they not only miss the content but the learning opportunity the teacher has devised to assist them learn as well as the underlying ideas and concepts. Often learning is built upon one concept or idea leads to another. Regularly absences can leave gaps that become increasing difficult catch up on. There are times when students are away from school due to sickness, family reason or leave. 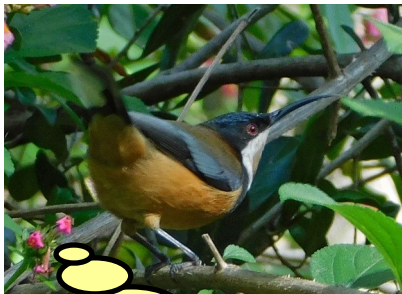

"Raw" Cold-process soapmaking—cured in slabs and sliced up, this 6 week old soap is now being tested in action—high in coconut and palm oil, it is very foamy and sudsy soap. While melt-and-pour soap mix is an easier way to create colourful scented soaps, the real process (with Sodium Hydroxide and blends of vegetable oils) demonstrated the chemistry of saponification for Year 8 late in Term 1.





# Reflection For The Week

## BEING THERE IN THE CRISIS

You say, 'It's not my responsibility. I'm not getting involved!' Psychologists call this 'compassionate disengagement', the tendency to avoid helping someone in trouble. Whether your motivation is inconvenience, self-protection, or indifference, it's wrong. 'Being there' is how you demonstrate your love for God and your neighbour. And helping requires recognising three kinds of crises:

- 1) *Accidental or situational crises.* These involve things like sudden threats to our well-being, disruptive events, unexpected losses, the discovery of a serious illness, the death of a loved one, a family breakdown, the loss of livelihood or security. The patriarch Job experienced all these events together at the same time and wondered why God had allowed so many bad things to happen to him.
- 2) *Developmental crises.* These occur in the course of everyday life: moving house, adjusting to marriage, parenting, retirement, ageing, declining health, and the loss of friends. Abraham and Sarah moved many times. They also endured years of childlessness and family stress, including the challenge of God's request that they sacrifice the child of destiny—Isaac.
- 3) *Existential crises.* These are when we face disturbing truths about ourselves. We may see ourselves as failures, grapple with being divorced or widowed, learn that our illness is incurable, experience rejection because of our race, class, age, or gender, or realise we may be getting too old to fulfil our life goals. True 'helpers' understand such crises, get involved, and encourage those in distress. They keep their eyes open, and are quick to 'offer comfort to the sorrowing.'

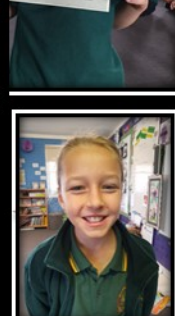
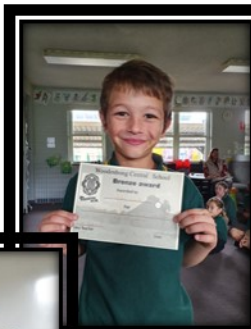

## BANANA MUESLI BITES



These Banana Muesli Bites are a perfect filler for lunchboxes or afternoon tea. They freeze well so are a great option to bake on the weekend and have ready to grab and go each school morning.

### Ingredients

3 cups oats  
1/4 cup sunflower seeds  
2 medium bananas (mashed)  
1/4 cup olive oil  
1/4 cup pumpkin seeds  
1 teaspoons vanilla extract  
1/2 teaspoons cinnamon  
1/3 cup sultanas / dates  
2 eggs  
1/2 cup honey

### Method

Preheat oven to 180 degrees.  
Mix all ingredients together.  
Press into slice tins (about 2cm deep) and bake for 25-30mins.  
Let cool and cut into desired sizes (square or rectangle).  
Freezes well, allow to defrost in lunchbox.
