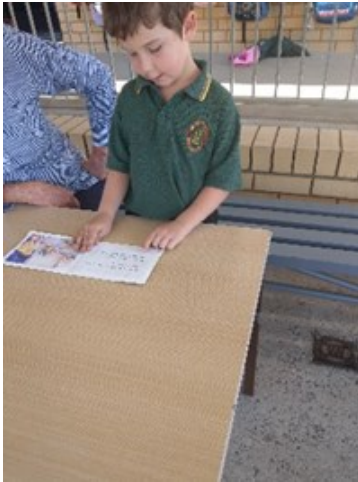

# Principal's Report

Our students have the opportunity to participate in a wide range of activities. When given the chance they can achieve fantastic things. In the last week:



- Two year 9 students performed well in the meat sheep judging competition at Murwillumbah Show. Tybah and Terry will now compete in the finals of this competition at the Sydney Royal Easter Show next year. Tybah in particular should be congratulated for coming first at the Murwillumbah Show.
- Gus competed at the Olympic Stadium in Homebush at Primary State Athletics for discuss
- Our students travelled to Tamworth for the Down the line competition. Individuals and the team performed well. This year they came second. This competition is growing across the State.
- Our Year 5/6 students are at camp.

It has great resources for parents and schools on safety. The site provides tips for parents to help keep their child or children safe online. The e-safety Commissioner's website also has a button where you can report abuse. The e-Safety Commissioner can act to have content (especially content impacting children) removed from social media sites. Just as we teach our children to be safe in the real world we need to teach our students to be safe in the cyber and virtual world.

This website is also sponsored by the Federal Government and has information from the Royal Children's Hospital. The cover from pregnancy to grown-ups. The canteen at Woodenbong Central School provides healthy options for our students. The school canteen is compliant with NSW DoE and Department of Health Healthy Food guidelines. Our canteen will operate whilst it is supported by parents and students. We have a school operated canteen at Woodenbong. That is the school runs the canteen. We keep the prices in the canteen as low as possible. This means it runs on very tight margins. We try to run the canteen so it breaks even. Sometime it has a small profit, sometimes it runs at a small loss. We can not continue to operate the canteen if it makes large losses for several years in a row. Fortunately, the losses we have



made recently have only been relatively small. However, into the future we will rely on the support of our students and parents. Tight margins is the main reason why we will only allow small amounts to be booked up in exceptional circumstances.

The staff, students and wider community of Woodenbong Central School continues towards making Woodenbong Central School a safe place for all. Woodenbong Central School has anti-bullying policy and procedures. A copy of these are available on the school website or via the front office upon request. The policy outlines how we define bullying and how we school responds to incidents of bullying. The policy is also on the school website <http://www.woodenbong-c.schools.nsw.edu.au/our-school/rules-policies> . There are many forms of bullying. However, bullying involves the inappropriate use of power, an intention to harm and it is repeated. Bullying is not acceptable behaviour at Woodenbong Central School. By working together we can minimise such incidents at the school. If as a parent you are concerned about incidents at school you should contact Ms Skerritt for incidents in high school and Ms Mason or Mrs Reid for incidents in primary.

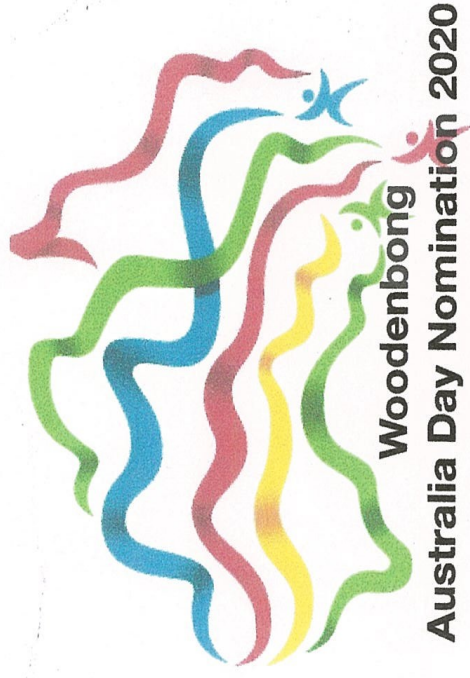

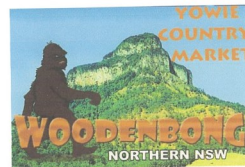

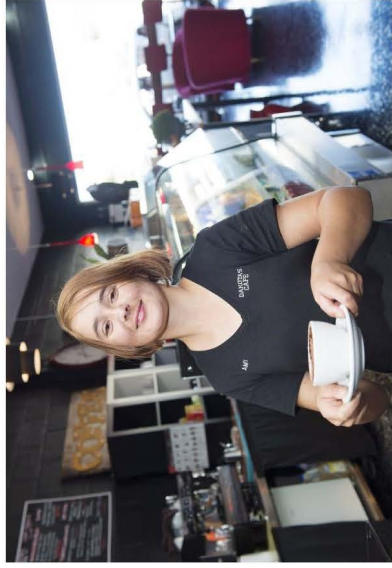

### MINTED PEA, BACON & RICOTTA SPAGHETTI

Bring a large saucepan of water to the boil. Cook spaghetti following packet directions, adding 300g podded peas in the last 3 minutes of cooking.

Meanwhile, heat 1 tbs olive oil in a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Add 250g chopped rindless shortcut bacon and 2 crushed garlic cloves. Cook for 4 to 5 minutes.

Drain spaghetti and peas, reserving 1/3 cup cooking water. Return spaghetti and peas to the pan. Add the bacon, 300g crumbled fresh ricotta cheese, 1/4 cup chopped mint leaves and the reserved water. Toss over low heat until combined. Season and drizzle with a little extra virgin olive oil and serve.

## DON'T BRAG ABOUT IT

If you have a tendency to remind people of all the good things you do and the sacrifices you make, read what Jesus said: *'When you have done all those things which you are commanded, say... 1. We can succumb to self-pity and go around complaining about how the world doesn't treat us right or give us a fair deal.
2. We can give way to resentment, walk around with a chip on our shoulder, and end up wondering why people don't want to be around us.
3. We can adopt the attitude Jesus taught and say, 'I'm only doing what God expects of me. And knowing *He* is pleased with me is reward enough.'
