# Principal's Report



At the end of last week, we heard the sad news that Heather Hill passed away. Our thoughts and sympathy are with her family. Heather was a much loved and respected teacher at Woodenbong Central School. At Woodenbong Central we directly experienced her love of teaching and learning. Her Memorial Service will be held on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> June in Woodenbong Picture Theatre Hall at 9:30am.



Heather taught many generations at Woodenbong and the surrounding villages. She began teaching at Woodenbong Central School in early 1960s. Heather came to Woodenbong from Tabulum. She retired, came back to WCS and taught full time until 2012. In 2013 she taught 1 day a week. Students in our Year 9 class were the last she taught full time and we appreciate her presence and memories at their Year 6 farewell.



Heather always looked at things and the world around her through a lens of *how can I use it to help teach my students*. Heather was looking for opportunities to assist with her students' learning. Whether this be a leaf, toy boats in gutters or something she had found in her garden. Heather developed a sense of wonder.

Many of our students will have fond memories of the learning experiences she created for them especially the excursion to her property or the overnight excursion in their classroom.



Heather Hill will be missed. Her impact on Woodenbong is significant. That impact is seen in hundreds of students she taught and the way those people have moved and acted throughout the World. Our thoughts and sympathies are with her family.



Opportunities allow our students to find out what they like and what might constitute future employment and career path. We also assist our students develop their talents through persistence, hard work and the development of a growth mindset. We believe that *our students deserve to live empowered lives with passion*.

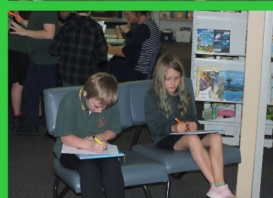
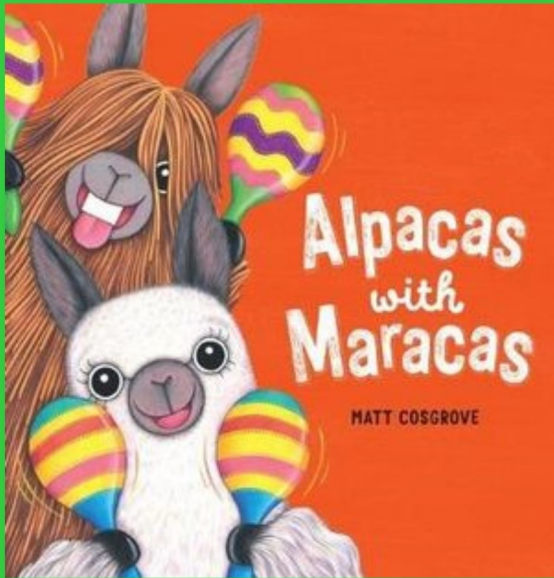
# Library News

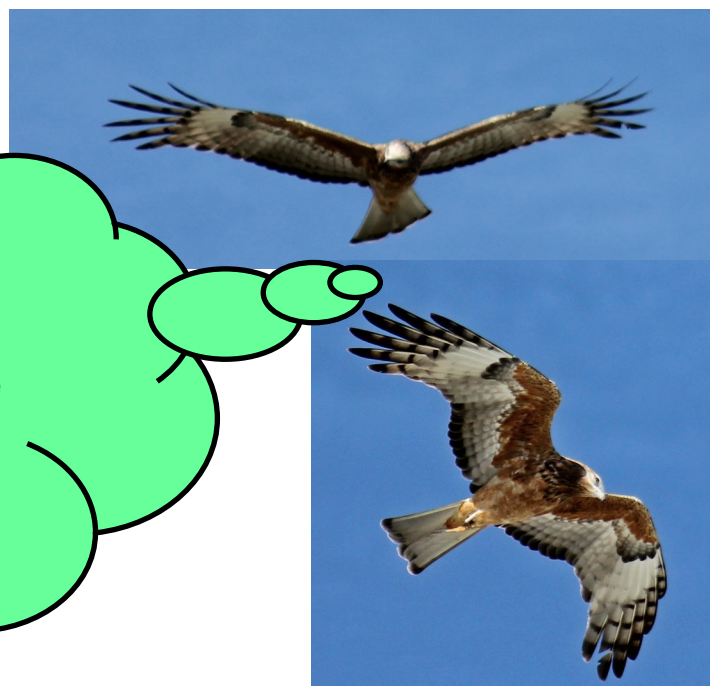
# SCIENCE AND OTHER NEWS WEEK 5 TERM 2

## Late Autumn freezes into Winter

# GIRLS' FUTSAL IN COFFS HARBOUR



On Wednesday of Week 4, WCS sent three girls' futsal teams down to Coffs Harbour to compete in the School Futsal Competition against schools from the northern region. This competition was a round-robin format, with the top two teams in each age group earning qualification for the Regional Championships in Port Macquarie in Term 3.

Our Under 14's team of Taylor and Chloe Newman, Shemaaya Williams, Maddison Fleming, Abby Bloomfield and Katelyn Fletcher had four matches on the day. Although the girls didn't come away with any wins, they had several close matches, and managed to score a goal in almost all of their games. As only two members of this team had played futsal at a competition level before, and most of the team was only 12 or 13 years old, this was a fantastic performance and bodes well for future years, as they will have most of the same team in the same age group next year.

Our Under 16's team of Shiloh Williams, Braeleigh Newton, Chloe Fleming, Hayley Hoffman, Jemimah Williams and Emily Weston were very competitive. Although they were unable to secure any wins, the girls finished with draws in each of their last two matches, which was a testament to their competitive spirit, and fantastic goal-keeping. Watching the improvement in the passing, court movement, and teamwork from this time last year was very pleasing. This is another team who will all still be Under 16 next year, and this should make them a tough team to beat for any opposition they encounter.



Our Under 19's team of Meg Green, Billie Black-O'Neill, Jess Smith, Tabitha Leonard, Bessie Wilson, Chelsea Wadsworth, Annaleise Barrett and Jemima Lee performed very well on the day. Although the girls narrowly lost their first two games, they fought back with a draw against Armidale Secondary College, and an impressive 4-1 victory over Coffs Harbour Senior College to secure a place in the semi-finals. In the semi's they came up against a red-hot Bellingen side, who had finished top of the age group, and as a result they were not able to progress to the final. As the girls went into this game carrying a series of injuries, they still showed great tenacity to fight to the end, with Jemima scoring an impressive goal.



The ability of our students was recognised on the day, with a number of students being offered the opportunity to compete for their region in the National Championships later this year. Those students were: Shemaaya Williams, Chloe Newman, Shiloh Williams, Jemimah Williams, Chloe Fleming, Emily Weston, Braeleigh Newton, Hayley Hoffman, Meg Green, Tabitha Leonard, Jemima Lee, Chelsea Wadsworth and Bessie Wilson. Congratulations to all those students!

Although it was a very long day for all the girls, and most of them returned home nursing at least one injury, I would like to commend them all on the spirit that they showed in all their matches. The greatest quality that Woodenbong students consistently demonstrate is their tenacity, and their refusal to be intimidated by bigger schools. Over the last 6 years of being involved with futsal at the school, this has been the thing I admire most about our students, and it was fantastic to be able to see them again exhibit this quality. I would also like to thank Mrs Amos for her assistance with coaching on the day – and to acknowledge that the teams seemed to perform better in the matches where she was the coach, than the ones I was there for...







I would also like to thank Tornell, Rachael, Tanya and Wendy for providing the transport required to make this possible. Without the assistance of parents and community members, our students would not have access to opportunities such as this, and I know the students enjoy having support when they are on the court.

Lastly, as this was the last day I will have the pleasure of taking Woodenbong students to futsal, I would like to thank everyone involved for all the great memories and memorable experiences. Car trips involving burping contests, Rastafarian dancing worms, terrible singing, and seemingly constant Macca's stops, combined with trips to the beach, Yoghurtland, and places that stock ice-cream in bulk are all things I will indelibly link with my time here at WCS. I also feel confident that the skill and commitment of the students leaves them well placed to build on



their current success in the sport. Futsal has taken two students to the USA, and will soon take another three to Brazil. Six years ago, I would not have thought that was possible! So again, thank you all for the memories, and I hope to run into you all at a futsal competition in the future in my newly appointed role as 'spy-coach'.

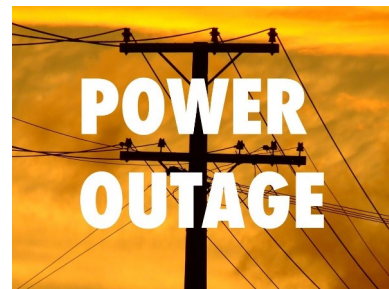

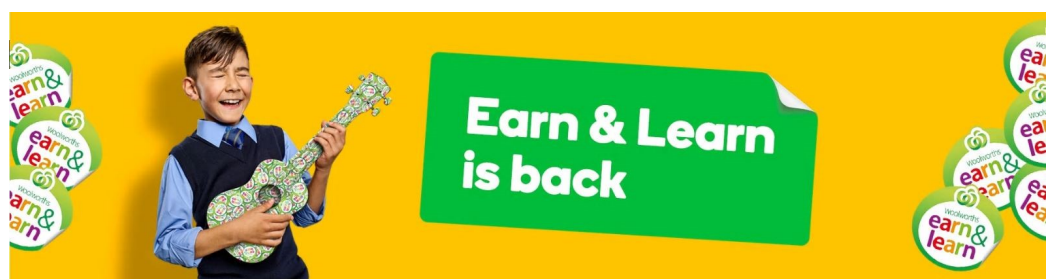

# Valid Testing

Dear Parents or Carers

*The Validation of Assessment for Learning & Individual Development (VALID)* test for Year6, 8 and 10 students will be held later this year . The test takes approximately 70 minutes. The **VALID Science 6, 8 and 10** test is an interactive, multimedia test completed entirely on a computer.

VALID Science 8 contains multiple choice, short response and extended response tasks that are grouped around real-world issues, including scientific investigations. This is a diagnostic test, with tasks framed on Stage 3, 4 and 5 (respectively) outcomes and essential content in the NSW Science Years K–10 Syllabus. Students will be tested on their:

- knowledge and understanding of science
- understanding and skills in the process of scientific investigation
- ability to evaluate evidence, make judgements and think critically
- ability to access information and communicate scientific ideas.

Students also complete a survey about their opinions, attitudes and values about science.

**Years 6, 9 and 10 will complete a trial test in Week 7**
