Principal's Report



Opportunities allow our students to find out what they like and what might constitute future employment and career path. We also assist our students develop their talents through persistence, hard work and the development of a growth mindset. We believe that *our students deserve to live empowered lives with passion.*

On Tuesday our Primary students hosted their Senior Citizens' Assembly. This is a great opportunity for our students to perform to an audience beyond their teachers and fellow students. The students' performances were fantastic and were very much appreciated by those in attendance. These days highlight the connection that the school has with our community and the community has with our school.

The Senior Citizens' Assembly also provided an opportunity for those present to reminisce about their days at Woodenbong Central School. For some present that first went to our school well over 80 years ago. It is always interesting to hear what it was like at Woodenbong Central School when they went to school. For example over 80 years ago what is now known as Wisdom Castle was used as the wood workroom. At that time, there were only 2 classrooms located near where the Community Room is today. These wooden classrooms had a partition that was opened once a week to form a larger room. From the description this would be either rooms 6 and 7 or rooms 8 and 9. It would be worth further investigation. It would also be interesting to put together a history of our school. The people, the building and the changes. We would easily be able to back 80-90 years of living memory.



At Woodenbong Central School we have school operated canteen. That is the school runs the canteen. We will continue to operate the canteen whilst it is supported by our parents and students. We keep the prices in the canteen as low as possible. This means it runs on very tight margins. We try to run the canteen so it breaks even. Sometime it has a small profit, sometimes it runs at a small loss. Tight margins is the reason why we will only allow small amounts to be booked up in exceptional circumstances.



As previously mentioned we need to ensure that we are compliant with NSW Department of Education Healthy Schools canteen policy <https://healthyschoolcanteens.nsw.gov.au/>. This policy requires schools to have a menu that is 75% everyday foods and 25% sometimes food. The canteen has reviewed our menu and found that we are compliant. Foods that are not everyday foods or sometimes foods have been replaced with foods or servings that are compliant with the policy.

This week our Year 10 students had their first attempt at the literacy component of the HSC minimum standards. They already know their reading results and should soon know the results of their writing test. The Year 10 students will sit the numeracy test within the next 2 weeks. NSW Government has maintained HSC Minimum Standards for literacy and numeracy. The transition to the new HSC minimum standard means that if:

- You are currently in Year you will need to do nothing
- You are in Year 11 you and will compete the HSC in 2020 you will need to:
 - ◆ Pass on online reading test or achieve a Band 8 or above in Year 9 reading NAPLAN in 2017, and
 - ◆ Pass on online numeracy test or achieve a Band 8 or above in Year 9 numeracy NAPLAN in 2017, and
 - ◆ Pass on online writing test or achieve a Band 8 or above in Year 9 writing NAPLAN in 2017, and

- Will complete the HSC in 2021 and beyond you will need to:
 - ◆ Pass an online reading test, and
 - ◆ Pass an online writing test, and
 - ◆ Pass an online numeracy test.

I have include a facts sheet elsewhere in this newsletter. Students will be able to access these online tests twice a year from Year 10 onwards. They can attempt the tests up to 5 years after they finish the HSC. Once a student passes the test they need not sit that particular test again. So a student could pass all the tests in year 10 or they could pass 1 or 2 test then they would have 4 more attempts to pass remaining tests in years 11 or 12. The purpose of the minimum standard is to demonstrate to employers that students have a minimum standard of comprehension, writing and numeracy if they have a HSC.

Schools can provide assistance for students who may need support with mental health issues. This support could ranges from answering questions to assistance with making referrals. We have a school counsellor on site every Monday and every second Tuesday. High school students can self-refer. With parent approval there is a process by which any student (Kindergarten to Year 12) can be referred to the counsellor. Reflection For The Week

THEY'RE NOT LISTENING - OR RESPONDING??

There are people you can't help—at least not right now. Notice what God said about the Israelites: 'Though I taught them again and again, they would not listen or respond.' Now, if God Himself can't help them, what chance do you have? Let's look at these people who usually can't be helped:

- (1) *People who keep making excuses.* Excuses are a crutch for lack of commitment and a smoke-screen for self-justification. You can't help someone until they're willing to take responsibility for their life and apply the solutions of Scripture. Think: if they won't listen to God, what difference will your opinion make?
- (2) *People who move in the wrong circles.* The Bible says, 'Bad company corrupts good character.' ([1 Corinthians 15:33 NLT](#)) There are people who simply don't belong in your life, and you can't move forward until you break the link that connects you. The company you keep influences your conduct and character, and those two things decide your future.
- (3) *People who blame God for their problems.* When trouble comes, they ask, 'Why did God allow this to happen to me?' The fact is, you'll never see God as your solution until you stop seeing Him as your problem. God laid it on the line for His people: 'I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing: therefore choose life.' ([Deuteronomy 30:19 KJV](#)) If you want to keep from getting discouraged, love people and pray for them, but spend your time with those who are willing to be helped.

They are asking help to make many green heart blocks on a background of white.

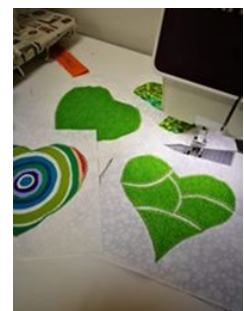
You can make your own versions as long as they are 6.5 inches unfinished (to be 6 inches finished).

SCIENCE NEWS WEEK 8 TERM 1

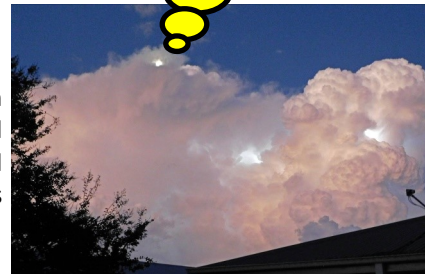
Both a rising moon

LONG-AWAITED RAIN... ALMOST DAILY STORMS

The afternoon/evening/night of Friday 16th of March brought substantial much needed rain to many parts of the Border Ranges/Scenic Rim, Northern Rivers and very heavy falls from the Sunshine Coast/hinterland to the Gold Coast. There had been light showers before this event, and some drizzle and light showers afterwards during a much cooler weekend.

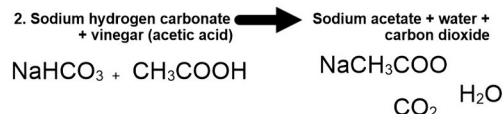
Recorded totals varied greatly around the area. About 22mm for the "main" Friday night fall in Woodenbong (almost 30mm for the 3-4 days), 71mm for Tabulam, upper Boomi Creek had 3 inches (75mm), 40mm at Warwick, Bonalbo had 21mm on Friday and 36mm on Sat.

However it has been warming up again to +30C temperatures this week and follow-up rain is eagerly awaited and also much-needed.
