Principal's Report



Opportunities allow our students to find out what they like and what might constitute future employment and career path. We also assist our students develop their talents through persistence, hard work and the development of a growth mindset. We believe that our students deserve to live empowered lives with passion.

This week we held an awards assembly for students who have received various awards in a variety of competitions and activities our students have participated in this year. Our students have so many opportunities that we do not have time during our presentation day assemblies to recognise all their achievements in the one assembly. It is fantastic to see how our students grasp their opportunities.

The awards assembly demonstrated how well our students have performed in:

- Science competitions
- Geography competition
- Mathematics competitions
- Agriculture with the Display Team at the Royal Easter Show and a variety of steer competitions.
- The Premier's Spelling Bee competition
- The Premier's Debating competitions in primary, Year 7/8 and Years 9/10. It should be noted that our Year 9/10 team were Zone champions and member of this team could be part of the Regional debating team.
- STEM. At the assembly we acknowledged Clay's Veivers selection in a STEM program. He will attend workshops at the University of Queensland in January and another midway through the year.
- Vocational Education. Several of our Year 10/11/12 students have School Based Traineeships in a variety of areas such as hospitality, hair dressing, automotive, health care or primary industries. Several more Year 10 students will commence their School Based Traineeships next year. Technology and our partnerships with outside organisations have greatly expanded what we can offer students.



At the awards assembly we also acknowledged Cheyanne, Tabitha and Abbie who were selected for the 2020 intake of University of Queensland's (UQ) Young Achievement Program (YAP). It should be noted that Woodenbong Central School is the ONLY NSW school with students in this program. We have worked with

and developed a great relationship with UQ over the last 11 years.

Over that time we have had between 1 and 4 students per year who have been selected for the program. The YAP program is a great opportunity for our students it provides our students with:

- A financial benefit, mentoring and workshops in Years 11 and 12
- \$30, 000 scholarship over 3 years for any of these students who study at UQ when they leave school at the end of Year 12.

The staff, students and wider community of Woodenbong Central School continues towards making Woodenbong Central School a



safe place for all. Woodenbong Central School has anti-bullying policy and procedures. A copy of these are available on the school website or via the front office upon request. The policy outlines how we define bullying and how we school responds to incidents of bullying. However, bullying involves the inappropriate use of power, an intention to harm and it is



repeated. Bullying is not acceptable behaviour at Woodenbong Central School. By working together we can minimise such incidents at the school. Year 8 Science Projects continue!

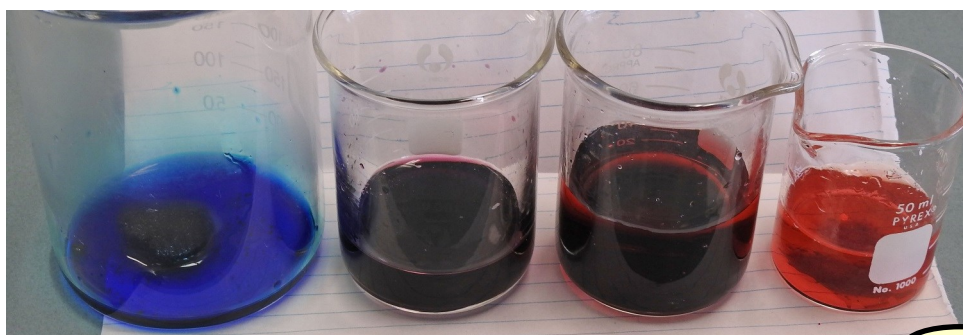

To see students engaged and working together, problem-solving and learning by “hands on” and theoretical research, pursuing questions and finding more questions to search for answers to, has been very encouraging.

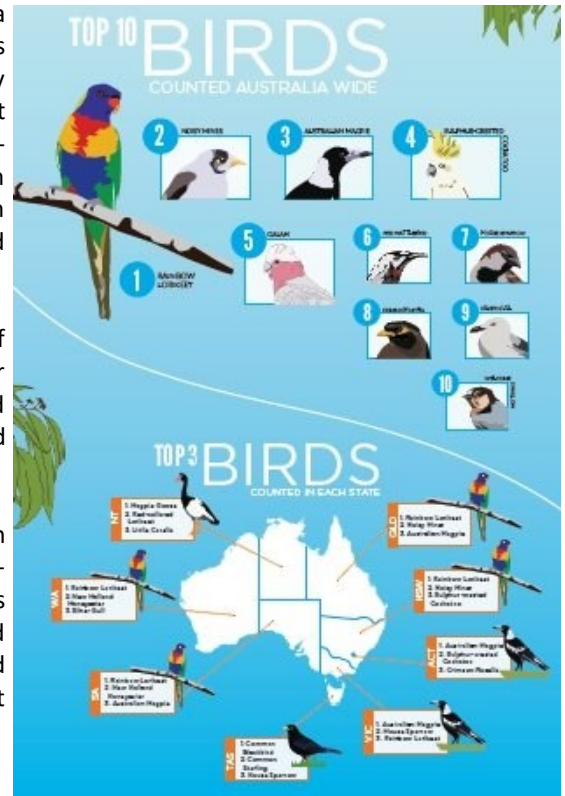

Birdlife Australia's National Bird Week

Last week was National Bird Week (21st-27th Oct) and BirdLife Australia promoted its 4th annual "Backyard Birdcount" - where keen birdwatchers were asked to pick a spot and record/upload a list of all bird species they could see in 20 minutes. 2019 being my first year attempting a "year list", it was also the first time I'd installed the Backyard Bird Count app and uploaded a few counts last weekend. I note that my neighbour and a few others in Woodenbong and surrounding areas also submitted counts. This collection of bird sightings is collated and used to monitor trends in bird numbers and distribution, like a vast citizen Science project.

Mid-Spring is probably the best time of year to see a maximum number of bird species active and it has certainly been the case that new sightings for the Year List has been popping up surprisingly. Murray Kelman has reached 207 for the year with the Crested Shrike-tit, while the Latham's Snipe and Brown Songlark have brought me to 148!

Also of local interest, on Tuesday Eric Taylor showed me a fallen "Nankeen Night Heron" which had met its demise (perhaps due to touching power-lines) out at the Golf Club. These impressive but nocturnal hunting Herons usually wade in the reedy wetlands and hunt fish and frogs after dusk, and roost in trees during the day, motionless and often un-noticed. I'd sighted and photographed one in a Morton Bay Fig at Collombatti last holidays, but one was also seen day-roosting in Woodenbong last term.

New Children- welcome to our new children (and their families) this term- Dolly, Aiyah and Bruce who have all settled in quickly.

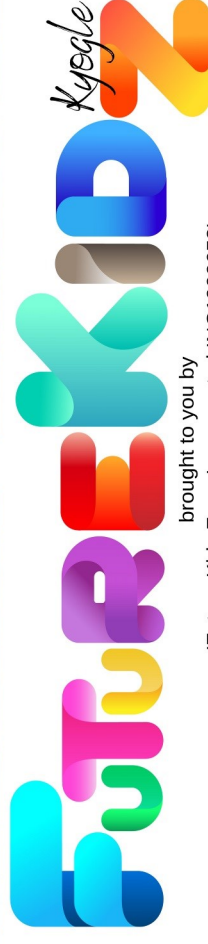

Reflection For The Week

DON'T BE A WORRYWORT?

If God lives within you, shouldn't it be obvious? How can you say you trust Him and then worry obsessively about your health, your kids, your job, and your finances? Concern is one thing, but worry is an affront to the God who has never let you down.

Paul writes, 'Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank Him for all he has done. Then you will experience God's peace.' ([Philippians 4:6-7 NLT](#)) Pray or worry—those are your options. Why did Jesus say, 'Take no thought for tomorrow'? (See [Matthew 6:34](#).) Because when you take thought you try to take control. And when that happens peace goes out the window!

Worry is like a snowball; it starts small, and as you keep rolling it forward it becomes big enough to bury you. All that's necessary to keep a stationary train from moving forward are two 15 cm blocks of wood, but once it builds up momentum it will crash through a two-metre-thick wall. So stop the worry train before it leaves the station!

God says, 'My grace is sufficient for you.' ([2 Corinthians 12:9 NIV](#)) God will give you only what you need for today; that way you have to keep trusting Him for tomorrow.
