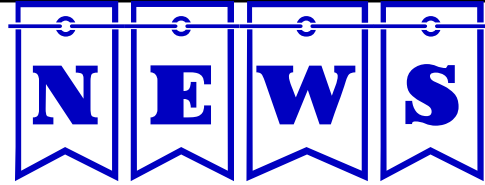

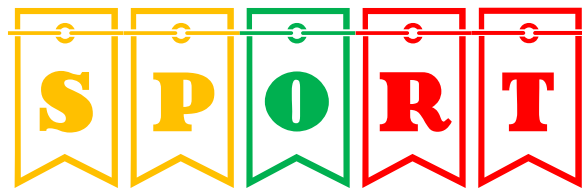

BYRON BAY WRITERS FESTIVAL STORYTELLERS

Jane Caro AM is a Walkley Award-winning Australian columnist, author, novelist, broadcaster, advertising writer, documentary maker, feminist and social commentator. Jane appears frequently on Q&A, The Drum and Sunrise. She has created and presented five documentary series for ABC's Compass, airing in 2015, 2016, 2017,

2018 and 2019. She and Catherine Fox present a popular podcast with Podcast One, Austereo 'Women With Clout'. She writes regular columns in Sunday Life.

Jane has published twelve books, including Just a Girl, Just a Queen and Just Flesh & Blood, a young adult trilogy about the life of Elizabeth Tudor, and the memoir Plain Speaking Jane. She created and edited Unbreakable which featured stories women writers had never told before and was published just before the Harvey Weinstein revelations. Her most recent non-fiction work is Accidental Feminists, about the fate of women over 50. The Mother is her first novel for adults.

Huda the Goddess is the current Australian Poetry Slam Champion and two-time Queensland champ. Huda is a spoken word poet, educator, mental health advocate, dancer and workshop facilitator. She describes poetry as one of her senses that allows her to turn her experiences into art; she is currently working on her first poetry collection. As a proud African-Muslim woman it is important to her that young women from her community are represented and their stories are shared. Poetry is her connection to communities, land and her people. Having the chance to make people feel something will always be her goal as an artist.

Huda is currently working on her first book, 'The Birth of Goddess' a poetry collection inspired by her lived experience. It talks about relationships, family, self-discovery, mental health and social issues that have affected her life. Being a black, Muslim, woman, and immigrant - it's all in the book.

Mirandi Riwoe is the author of The Burnished Sun, a collection of short stories and novellas. Her novel Stone Sky Gold Mountain won the Queensland Literary Award for Fiction and the ARA Historical Novel Prize and was shortlisted for the Stella Prize and longlisted for the Miles Franklin Award. Her novella The Fish Girl won Seizure's Viva la Novella and was shortlisted for the Stella Prize. Mirandi has a PhD in Creative Writing and Literary Studies (QUT).

Nigel Featherstone is an Australian writer who has been published widely. His war novel, Bodies of Men, was published by Hachette Australia in 2019. It was longlisted for the 2020 ARA Historical Novel Prize, shortlisted in the 2019 Queensland Literary Awards, and shortlisted for the 2020 ACT Book of the Year. Nigel's new novel, My Heart is a Little Wild Thing, is published by Ultimo Press (Hardie Grant). His short stories have appeared in the Review of Australian Fiction, Meanjin, and Overland among many other journals, and his creative nonfiction has been published by The Guardian, Sydney Morning Herald, Canberra Times, and the Chicago Quarterly Review, among other outlets. He wrote the libretto for The Weight of Light, as commissioned by the Hume Conservatorium, with the music composed by James Humberstone of the Sydney Conservatorium of Music; this work was developed by The Street Theatre in Canberra and had its world premiere in 2018. Nigel is currently working on a play with spoken-word songs, which is being developed by The Street Theatre and has been supported by Create NSW. Nigel lives on unceded Ngunnawal / Ngambri / Gundangara Country (otherwise known as the NSW Southern Tablelands).

Strawberry delight!

Late autumn to mid-winter is peak season for delicious, juicy strawberries which are packed with vitamin C. Served cold or warm, fuss-free strawberries are the go-to favourite for young and old.

Store strawberries in the fridge and use within 1 to 2 days of purchase. To prepare, simply wash and hull the strawberries by removing the leafy green stem and leaves.

TIME TO GET BERRY CREATIVE...

- Attractive and tasty, these breakfast cups are sure to entice. Layer chopped strawberries with reduced fat yoghurt, toasted muesli and a swirl of honey in serving cups.
- Whole hulled strawberries threaded onto paddle-pop sticks are a quick and easy lunchbox treat. For something extra special, drizzle the strawberries with melted chocolate.
- For dessert, scatter hulled strawberries on a baking tray lined with baking paper. Sprinkle with a little caster sugar and roast in the oven at 200°C (fan-forced) for 10 minutes until softened. Serve strawberries with vanilla ice-cream.

Behaviour code for students

NSW public schools

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive and responsive learning environments for everyone. We teach and model the behaviours we value in our students.

In NSW public schools students are expected to:

- Respect other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- Follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- Strive for the highest standards in learning
- Respect all members of the school community and show courtesy to all students, teachers and community members
- Resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- Comply with the school's uniform policy or dress code
- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Respect all property
- Not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco into our schools
- Not bully, harass, intimidate or discriminate against anyone in our schools

Schools take strong action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high quality teaching and learning.

Behaviour Code for Students: Actions

Promoting the learning, wellbeing and safety of all students in NSW Public Schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

Respect

- Treat one another with dignity
- Speak and behave courteously
- Cooperate with others
- Develop positive and respectful relationships and think about the effect on relationships before acting
- Value the interests, ability and culture of others
- Dress appropriately by complying with the school uniform or dress code
- Take care with property

Safety

- Model and follow departmental, school and/or class codes of behaviour and conduct
- Negotiate and resolve conflict with empathy
- Take personal responsibility for behaviour and actions
- Care for self and others
- Avoid dangerous behaviour and encourage others to avoid dangerous behaviour

Engagement

- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Arrive at school and class on time
- Be prepared for every lesson
- Actively participate in learning
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments. The department provides a policy framework and resources such as Legal Issues Bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context the NSW Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

Good morning,

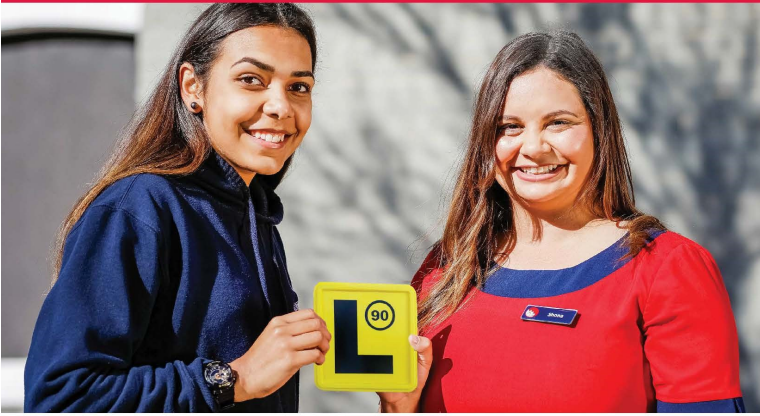
I am now at a stage when I have started 'down sizing'. In so doing, I found the enclosed copies of "Panorama" for the years 1967, 68, 69. Instead of throwing them out, thought you might like to have a look at them in case you haven't got copies of Panorama going back that far and also to get a small sense of the school more than 50 years ago!

I enjoyed my three years (1966-68) at Woodenborg. Most of us were single and stayed at the Lindesay Lodge Guest House on the corner diagonally opposite the Catholic Church. I heard that, subsequently, it was burnt down and replaced by other dwellings.

One of my special memories is, along with a couple of other teachers, climbing Mt Lindesay. I recall we left our names in a book left at the top of Mt Lindesay for that purpose. Another memory is the long drive back to Newcastle or Sydney from where most of us came at the end of each term.

I expect many of those I taught are now retired and are great/grandparents! I believe schools like W.C.S. carry out a great service for remote/rural areas.

Reflection For The Week

Be Wise With Your \$\$\$

God's Word says you're to do two things with your money.

- 1) **Sow some.** The Bible says, *'Whoever sows generously will also reap generously.'* ([2 Corinthians 9:6 NIV](#)) You say, 'But things are a bit tight for me right now.' Don't withhold because you are afraid of not having enough. Give God a seed to work with, and He will make sure you have a harvest when you need it. His ability to provide is not limited by the world's economy. Do what Isaac did: *'There was a famine in the land... 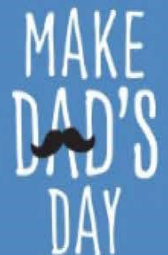

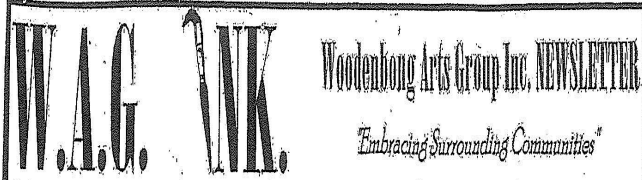

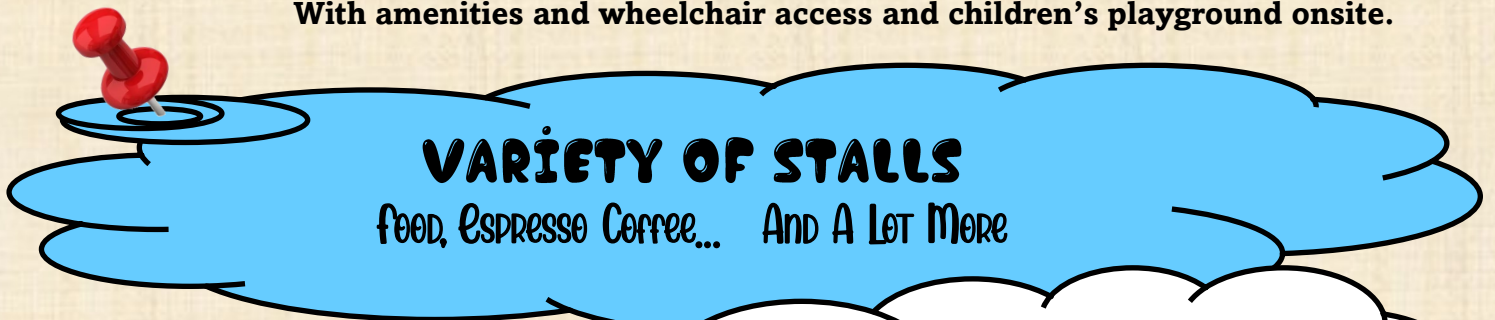
